Introduction from Bernard Ward, Chairman

Welcome to our Winter issue of the Squeaky Wheel

Happy New Year to one and all, I trust you all had as good a Christmas as you would have hoped for, or even better!

We have included our 2018 calendar and you will see that we have many of the regular events including a Drive It Day – same start venue with an excellent finish venue up at Gaydon – and the Sussex Spring Spree. Due to a date clash with a certain wedding the organisers have, with little notice, re-arranged their event so it can take place a couple of weeks later, on 2nd June leaving you all the chance to follow the proceedings and, of course the cup final. We are again planning a tour round the Chilterns, which I see is titled the Midsomer Whereabouts, sounds interesting. The programme is on the website and will of course be updated as and when. Our CVG Facebook Group is up and running and is being used more and more, so thanks for joining in. One post you may have seen back in October was of a rather smart maroon Capri which lead me to contact the owner and produce between us a Cars the Star article which I hope we can include in the next issue. I hope to see many photos of events posted, not just CVG events, but any that you attend as it will tell others what there is and what they are like.

On to committee things; in the last issue I explained that we, together with the other interest groups, were to invite nominations from anyone who would be willing to join the committee, a process that will take place each year and one of our committee would step down in rotation to stand against any candidates. Perhaps it is a reflection of how well we on the committee are all doing that no-one has put their name forward so we volunteers remain as we are, ready and willing to serve you all etc. Peter Adams joined us last year and I am pleased that he is running his South Devon Railway meet for the fourth year now this May, and has started up a regular South Devon Railway meeting of members with their cars.

I make the point elsewhere that anyone, anywhere, can organise events on behalf of the CVG and that we and Brighton Headquarters are most willing to help any volunteer to put on a run or a display with advice, publicity and financial support. We had a presence at the indoor display at Event City in Manchester in the autumn last year and will be doing so again this year.

The advert for my Ireland Tour is included again, pointing out that there are only two places left so anyone still deliberating will need to make their minds up if they wish to join us.

For many years the only way open to members entering our events was to send a cheque in to the organiser with their entry form. Many clubs are now moving to pay-on-line entries which allow payment through, for example, PayPal, which automatically takes a secure payment from your bank account and enables the details of entrant and vehicle to be populated on line. No need for any paper, no stamp and no need to bother the treasurer with a cheque that would need to be paid into the club bank account.

Having said that, we are not at that stage as the facility to enter on line through our Boundless website, designed and run by Brighton, is not yet available and, in truth, may not be for some time yet.

What we can offer however is payment by bank transfer, known as BACS, which has been taken up by a number of you in the past year. Combined with the online completion of the entry form it will not be necessary for you to leave the house until the morning of the event, and it will save a stamp which costs more than ten shillings in old money. To explain, the entry form is produced in Word format, or as an editable pdf, and can be downloaded onto your computer.



Then the form can be populated and sent off as an email attachment to the organiser. It is not our practice to include the CVG bank details on the entry form as that is in effect a public document, available to all persons, good or bad. What needs to happen, a once only, is to request these details from the organiser which can then be used to BACS the entry fee into the CVG account. Our same details apply to any future bookings.

The organiser should be told that the payment is to be made that way and It is the job then of the treasurer (me) to check the bank statement on line on a regular basis and let the event organiser know that payments have been received. There is no need to provide receipts of payment as the webpage of your bank gives that confirmation. It will also save me several trips down to the bank.

An on-line payment arrangement has already been developed by a volunteer Boundless member (who knows about such things) and operates successfully for certain Motorsport events that are held in the southeast and it is hoped that it may be adapted to be used for CVG events. Once the entrant registers on the website It allows payments on line and has the advantage of storing certain details for future use, such as address, car details and MSA competition numbers. For a classic car event it would need different information but all things are possible, given time.

It only leaves me to thank everyone who helped with the events last year, and that includes all of you who took part, as without you there wouldn't be any events, to Editor in Chief Geoff Wooldridge for putting our Squeaky Wheels together and to Member Communities at Brighton for all their continuing help and support. We wish you all a most enjoyable year.

Manchester Classic Car Show—Event City

16 - 17TH SEPTEMBER 2017

As well as the Motorsport and Marshalling Groups the local NW Motorsport interest group is well known for, the display which included classics and 4X4 vehicles. The aim was to reach out to the many existing members of Boundless by CSMA and stimulate more activities in the NW.



The Motorsport display had one of Steve Johnson's many Micras and Simon Boardman's lovely Volvo Amazon Historic Road Rally car. Both cars attracted a great deal of interest.

Quite a number of members already marshal on both stage and historic road events. Members will be out on Rally of the Tests and Le Jog in the next few months.

In the classic vehicle display there was a lovely 1954 Sunbeam Alpine, 1956 Morris Minor and 1973 Hillman Hunter GLS all of which have campaigned in motorsport in the past, although seldom remembered.

The Frost Story

At the NEC Classic Show we had a visitation from Lee Gameson of Frost, a company whose heart is in classic vehicles and it seemed very relevant to find out a bit more about what they do, and pass it on to you good readers.

Lee explained that the company was established in 1905 in Rochdale, Lancashire, as a



general Engineering company but soon becoming specialists in Sheet Metal Working Machinery. When Mr Frost died in 1948 the company was bought by the Wood family. In the 1980's, the Company was spending time advising customers where to find various types of restoration equipment, partly because of the continued manufacture of the wheeling machine (English Wheel) and partly due to

Mike Wood's contacts from racing classic cars. He then had an idea to put his knowledge of car restoration into a little sales booklet and so Frost Restoration was born.

Frost Auto is a unique business where you can find everything you need for your Classic or Custom car or motorbike bike from Rust Treatments and Paints to Specialist Mechanical and Bodywork Tools and Lee described the range of brands some of which are exclusive to Frost UK such as POR 15 (Paint, Rust Treatment, Tank Sealer), Eastwood (Paint, Automotive Tools), Evaporust and Dinitrol (Rust Treatment) as well as hard to find tools which are not available from major retailers. They have also launched their own FROST branded products, offering a premium quality at a bargain price.

In 2016, due to the rapid expansion of the business and the need for greater stock holding and improved logistics, they relocated to a 50,000 sq ft facility between Manchester and Warrington, Cheshire, with a new retail store on site, Lee added that they are always happy to offer advice over the phone and they even have Fuzz Townsend on their team as technical advisor, although I doubt he will be the one picking up the phone.



Since 2006, the Frost Auto has sponsored VSCC trials, one of the oldest forms of motor sport, where competing cars must climb sections of varying gradient and difficulty and, out of interest, one customer of theirs, Andy Saunders, created what is come to be known as the Picasso Citroen using Frost tooling for the metal work. It was displayed recently at the Goodwood Festival of Speed and is supposedly roadworthy but I'm not sure about the headlights?

Lee reckons they mail out thousands of their full colour 100 page plus catalogue so you might wish to join their numbers by getting in touch with them and requesting one. We don't, as a policy, recommend any particular product or company but it's good to know that such companies exist and are able to offer advice and specialist service for the classic owner. Should anyone place orders until 28th February 2018 Frost is offering a 5% discount to CVG members, by quoting code CVG1718.
