Coastwatch Talk

On the 11th May 2022 the Ipswich Group was given a talk by Nick Garrett White the acting manager of Felixstowe National Coastwatch.

Thirty years ago, there were 30 Lightships, 43 Coastguard Stations and 160 Lighthouses, most are now closed.

In 1994 when two fishermen lost their lives off the of Cornish coast near a recently closed Coastguard Lookout, local people decided to open and restore the visual watch. Then in 1996 the first National Coastwatch Institution (NCI) station was opened at Bass Point on the Lizard. Currently there are 57 NCI stations operational and manned by 2600 volunteers keeping watch around the British Isles from Fleetwood in the north west, to the south and east of England to Hornsea in East Riding of Yorkshire in the north west.

A log of all water based activities are kept during each watch and when requested weather conditions can be passed to fishermen and yachtsman before they put to sea. Also, web cams are available for those who wish to identify weather and sea conditions prior to doing any water sport activities which should reduce the need for HM Coastguard response.

It is interesting to note the number of incidents logged in 2021 at Felixstowe National Coastwatch with a total of 14449 vessels, which includes:- 3601 Commercial vessels, 7428 Leisure vessels, 3359 Work boats (fishing, tugs, pilot launcher), 61 Military and boarder force vessels. All of which was logged by 70 volunteers during a 5386 man hours of watch.

High technology and sophisticated systems such as radar and telecommunications have vastly improved safety at sea, but there are no substitute for a watchful pair of eyes. Accidents do happen and a computer cannot spot a distress flare, people in trouble during water sport activities, an overturned boat and people travelling along the coastal path.

Nick who is based at Martello Tower `P` Felixstowe, gave a good insight into the operational procedures that goes on at the National Coastwatch Stations.
