Back by members' popular demand – and it really is!



We are going back to the summer joys of Portland and the Jurassic coast, but with a different restaurant finish to go with the unique lighthouse and views. We will meet just south of Lyndhurst at The Swan on A35, for registration, tea, coffee and biscuits (other buffet food available at cost).

After a short briefing we will pass through a beautiful section of the New Forest, crossing into Dorset and skirting Bournemouth, Poole Harbour and the Arne Nature Reserve made famous on Springwatch TV with its heaths, reed beds and natural history, to reach the Isle of Purbeck and the hauntingly impressive ruins of Corfe Castle.

Weather-wise, obviously it was quite a chilly January day, but it remained dry throughout although there were still some snow and ice on the road edges left over from a few days previously leaving road surfaces pretty much as wet and mucky as I'd predicted.

Boundless Members Day Event 15th March Fleet Air Arm Museum

The Boundless Members Day at the Fleet Air Arm Museum was the venue for a reunion of all those that went to Normandy France with the Classic Vehicle Group in June 2024.

We all seemed to arrive at the same time for the afternoon session at the museum and after a chat in the car park we wound our way to the registration area. With our lanyard and museum brochure in hand we moved into the main exhibition halls.

Nestled in the heart of Somerset, the Museum offers a captivating journey through the history of naval aviation and more. Located at the Royal Naval Air Station Yeovilton, it is a treasure trove of aircraft, artifacts, and exhibitions that celebrate the valour and innovation of the Fleet Air Arm.

In Hall 1, you explore the origins of naval aviation. This section covers the early experiments in flight and the advent of aircraft carriers. Highlights include the Short S.27, one of the first aircraft designed for naval use, and the story of the first successful carrier landing by Edwin Harris Dunning in 1917.



Hall 2 delves into the critical

role of the Fleet Air Arm during World War II. The exhibition features legendary aircraft such as the Fairey Swordfish and the Supermarine Seafire. Interactive displays and personal accounts bring to life the daring missions and battles that shaped the course of the war.

In Hall 3 the Cold War era is vividly illustrated, where visitors can witness the technological advancements that occurred during this period. Aircraft such as the Sea Vixen and the Phantom FG.1 showcase the transition from propeller-driven planes to jet fighters. The hall also explores the strategic importance of naval aviation during the tense geopolitical climate of the Cold War.

Hall 4 is dedicated to the modern era of naval aviation. This section features state-of-the-art aircraft like the Merlin helicopter and the F-35 Lightning II. Visitors can learn about the latest technological innovations and the ongoing evolution of the Fleet Air Arm's capabilities.



One surprising attraction was the Aircraft Carrier Experience where the interactive exhibit simulates life aboard an aircraft carrier, complete with realistic sights and sounds. Visitors can explore the flight deck, hangar, and control rooms, gaining a deeper understanding of the challenges and operations of naval aviation.

However, my favourite exhibit was Concorde 002. First flown on 9th April 1969, captained by Brian Trubshaw, this prototype made 196 supersonic runs during its total 438 test flights. Still with all the test equipment on board, as never flew with paying passengers, it was nice to see a section set



by showing passenger seats and you can imagine them crossing Concorde's most famous and regular routes between London/Paris and New York, but also destinations in South America, Bahrain, and Singapore.

At 4:30pm it was time to depart, I just wish we had another couple of hours but hey, maybe a good excuse to make another visit.

Why the survey is vital...

The Federation of British Historic Vehicle Clubs will have to argue even more strongly for historic vehicles to retain their current access and freedoms on our roads in the coming years as we navigate the most challenging period in our history.

To defend our freedom to use yesterday's vehicles on tomorrow's roads, we need your help completing this crucial survey.

We conduct this major research every five years and more than 15,000 enthusiasts participated last time around. We want to make this survey the largest and most comprehensive of its kind in the world, so please take part, have your say, and help keep the historic vehicles that we love on the road for the benefit of everyone in the future.

The Federation represents more than 500 clubs, museums, and individual members passionate about historic vehicles older than 30 years, such as cars, motorcycles, buses, coaches, lorries, agricultural, military, or steam vehicles.

Due to changing political and environmental influences, the historic vehicle community, events, the freedom to use the roads, and even the fuel we use are under increasing threats and pressures.

The FBHVC aims to lobby the Government against detrimental legislation and restrictions that could impact the future of historic vehicles. However, to secure a successful outcome, the organisation needs dependable data on the significance and scope of the historic vehicle movement. The responses you provide will help

shape the future of historic vehicles in Great Britain over the next five years by providing crucial data.

Our history of authoritative research

The Federation first conducted research in 1997 and has repeated the process at least every five years since then. HM Government values this research for providing a consistent approach that demonstrates accurate traceability and the development of the historic vehicle movement over time. Such transparency fosters trust in the government and ensures that the 1.9 million historic vehicles recorded on the DVLA database are treated fairly and appropriately.

The survey encompasses all historic road vehicles, including cars, bikes, lorries, vans/motorhomes, military vehicles, buses/coaches, tractors/agricultural vehicles, and steam vehicles.
